- 1) Establishment of an FAO internal multi-disciplinary working group on disabilities: The working group brings together representatives of all five strategic programmes of FAO. It serves as a platform for informal exchange of good practices for disability inclusion, as well as for joint effots to strengthen FAO's technical work in this area.
- 2) Stock-taking of disability inclusive projects within FAO: The purpose was to identify ongoing FAO projects that include persons with disabilities, with the aim of capturing their key features in terms of entry points, technical design, implementation modalities and results acheived. Results of the stocktaking are being used to develop a technical guidance note for FAO country offices to support disability inclusive programming at country level.
- 3) Partnerships: FAO actively participated in the Global Disability Summit in London on 24 July 2018, to highlight the linkages between disability and food security and announce its commitments to: a) integrate questions about the needs of persons with disabilities in FAO's needs assessments for humanitarian and resilience building projects; b) give special attention to the full inclusion of rural persons with disabilities in the design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of social protection systems. Efforts have also been made to establish partnerships with NGOs dealing with disability isses (including HI) and to strengthen FAO's collaboration on disabilities with IFAD and WFP. Furthermore, FAO participated as observer in activities of the interagency working groups for the formulation of the United Nations Disability Inclusion Strategy (UNDIS) and contributed with technical inputs as needed.
