Georgia commits to contribute to the restoration of Incidents Prevention and Response Mechanism (IPRM) in Gali district of Abkhazia, Georgia, within the Geneva International Discussions format, with the view to prevent possible escalation of the situation on the ground. Georgia commits to provide political support to international efforts with the view to prevent or resolve a crisis.	Policy	Political Leadership to Prevent and End Conflicts	174007
Georgia commits to use all available early warning mechanisms, including through international engagement, to prevent potential conflict situations and escalation of conflict on the territory of Georgia. With this, Georgia will continue its efforts aimed at ensuring the international monitoring inside the occupied regions of Abkhazia and Tskhinvali region/South Ossetia. Georgia remains committed to the peaceful resolution of the conflict, and reiterates its unilateral non-use of force pledge first undertaken in 2010 and thereafter reiterated at several international forums, as well as approved by the Parliament of Georgia in 2013. Political Leadership to Prevent and End Conflicts

POLITICAL LEADERSHIP TO PREVENT AND END CONFLICTS

- Commit to act early upon potential conflict situations based on early warning findings and shared conflict analysis, in accordance with international law.
- Commit to improve prevention and peaceful resolution capacities at the national, regional and international level improving the ability to work on multiple crises simultaneously.
- Commit to sustain political leadership and engagement through all stages of a crisis to prevent the emergence or relapse into conflict.
- Commit to address root causes of conflict and work to reduce fragility by investing in the development of inclusive, peaceful societies.
